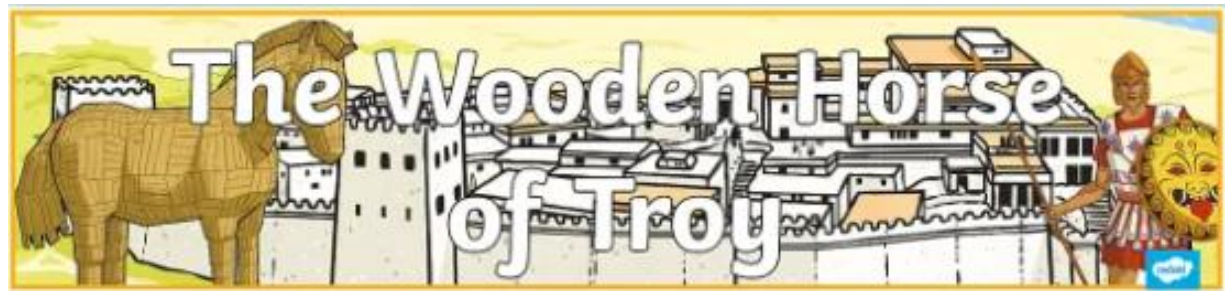


Key Subject Vocabulary

| The Trojan Horse | A wooden horse planned by Odysseus to help the Greeks trick the Trojans |
| Ancient Greece | A civilization and collection of city-states in the Mediterranean |
| Authentic | Something which has been proved to be genuine |
| Biased | Something which is prejudiced for or against someone or something |
| Historical Fact | Something which is known to have happened – normally where there is proof |
| Legend | A traditional story thought to be historical and often about the exploits of a great person |
| Myth | A traditional story which often involves describes the early history of a people and ancient religions |
| Judgment | Making a considered decision and sensible conclusion |
| Evaluate | To judge the importance, value or accuracy of something |
| Troy | A city in what is now Turkey that was scene of the Trojan war |
